Statement of the chairperson at the first general assembly of the ACC, August 15th, 2000

Prehistory

What we have done is to found a European organization working for the development of an enlightened European debate. We consider a system of community colleges on a common European level to be an outstanding way of promoting this objective. Now, what is the history of this idea?

I think the overall history or background is, that it is necessary to discuss common issues among common people. Our association is only a brick in a huge puzzle, where more and more people will realize that common debate and knowledge of each other in a still more integrated Europe is a simple necessity. This is a necessity, if the Europeans want to develop, what Zygmunt Bauman, a sociologist from Poland, called "the art of living together".

So, we are not outstanding, when realizing this necessity.

If you take it more narrow, I think the history of the ACC is linked up with the feeling, that developing the "art of living together" was exactly what took place at the so-called minority courses in 1997 and 1998 (and also in 1999 and 2000) –taking place at the Højskolen Østersøen.

If asking a participant in one of these courses after taking place, I think none of us/them would understand, why Europe has been the most violent continent in world history.

This made more participants ask, how they could set up institutions like it in their own countries. We call the institutions "Community College's".

Among them Laszlo, David some more..

Elly Andersen (also Højskolen Østersøen) and I figured then, it would be an idea to keep this network, which was established during the two courses and in future to link future participants in these minority- and similar courses as well. We wanted to make sense out of this network on this continent.

So, if we are outstanding in our idea, it is by linking a European network of people inspired and experienced with the boarding school format to the European integration process. The timing makes us special.

What happened before August 1999 was then, that we tried to find out, if there was interest in the founding of such an organization. There was really a lot, and we then asked people to sign up for membership. The sign up process was not that enthusiastic —only half of the half signed up before deadline. This made us decide, that we had to cancel the idea. I was at the minority-course in 1999, invited by Jesper Nielsen (the co-ordinator) to present the idea for the new group, but I actually already gave it up, when I had a very angry message from Mjellma in Macedonia. Some people can shout by e-mail, and

Mjellma was kind of shouting, that there was absolutely no way she would ever forgive, if we did not continue.

After the Minority course 1999, where there was also a huge interest in the project, we decided to establish the association. We invited then to the Statutory General Assembly at the 11/8 last years, and we made sure in beforehand, that there were candidates for all the positions in the board.

Since we insist on being a European organisation, and since we also would like to present ourselves as such, it is more than pure luck, that the board was put together by not only qualified persons, but also persons representing both north, south, east, west etc. and the board consists now of Siebren de Boer (Utrecht), Mjellma Mehmeti (Skopje), Linda Jakobsone (Riga), Dani Laszlo (Cluj-Koloszvar), Jesper Nielsen (Aabenraa), Conchi Gallego (Spain) and me + Eva Valvo and Josephine Listerby from Pisa and Mariehamn as substitutes.

The association was founded at a meeting on the Internet. It was on the 11/8 and if someone remembers, it was the day of the solar eclipse.

I think, that it was just when the ACC was founded that the light returned.

The Danish minister of Education at least know a lot about who we are, since she was also present at the conference on Højskolen Østersøen.

Conchi has worked for us in Bruxelles and Strasbourg at different locations, and still more information coming from these places witnesses, that we are known in these institutions as well.
